Fire Department News

Fire Chief John Beatsch

The Kentucky Firefighters Association is an organization that represents 400 fire departments from all over the state. Each year the KFA holds a convention to discuss current issues, set legislative agendas and elect officers of the organization. Southgate Fire Chief John Beatsch is currently the Second Vice President of the KFA. He will become the President of the association in 2019/2020. In August 2020 the annual convention of the KFA will be held in Northern Kentucky with the Southgate Volunteer Fire Department serving as the host department.

On Saturday November 25 the Southgate Fire Department will hold a \$10,000 Reverse Raffle at St. Joes in Cold Spring. Tickets for this event are \$100. Each ticket admits two people and includes dinner for two, soft drinks, beer, wine and a limited supply of mixers. Tickets will be drawn throughout the evening eliminating ticket holders until a winner is found and the \$10,000 jackpot is awarded. Consolation prizes will also be awarded throughout the evening. Pet Waste stations

Pet Waste stations have been installed in the parks. The City of Southgate has an ordinance requiring pets to be on a leash and owners clean up animal feces and dispose of in a sanitary manner. The penalty can be a civil fine of not less than \$50 but not more than \$100 per day per violation.

Snow Emergency

Please keep in mind that there is no parking on designated streets when snow exceeds three (3) inches or during a declared snow emergency. Any vehicle parked on the pavement or right-of-way of any designated street at the time of the snow emergency should be removed within three (3) hours of a snow emergency if declared between 6 am and 8 pm. If an emergency is declared between 8 pm and 6 am, then the vehicle shall be removed prior to 9 am that morning. The City will broadcast snow

emergencies on local TV and radio stations. Vehicles may be towed at the owner's expense if not moved when a snow emergency has been declared. Thank you for your cooperation.

Park and Tree Board News

The Southgate Park and Tree Board continues to work with the City Maintenance Staff to prepare the flower beds for fall and to inventory needed improvements. A new sit-up station has been added to the outdoor fitness center located near the entrance to the trailhead at the Southgate Community Center.

Since the last issue of *Citylines*: Our activities have included: development of an overall plan for parks, recreation, and care of the urban forest, 2017-2020; applying for funds to upgrade the trail, and receiving a grant through the Campbell County Extension Service. This will help to replace trees along the trail. Trees had to be removed due to damage by beavers or the emerald ash borer. Implementation of the grant to replace some of the trees will begin in early November 2017.



On September 14, the Tree Board hosted a rock painting class for "Back the Blue" to show support for our police officers. This was a great

success and was part of a region wide initiative sponsored by the Northern Kentucky Hidden Rocks organization. Currently the Tree Board is preparing the

renewal application to retain our status as a Tree City USA (13 years) and the Growth Award (12 years). These are due in December and are awarded through the National Arbor Day Foundation, in cooperation with the Kentucky Division of Forestry.

The Park and Tree Board would like to remind residents who wish to plant street trees (trees planted between the street and the sidewalk), that there are guidelines established by ordinance governing the placement, size, and choice of tree. Residents must consult with the Park and Tree Board before planting street trees.

The Park and Tree Board meets on the second Monday of each month, 6:00 p.m., in the Mayor's Office at the City Building. Persons interested in becoming a member or who need information about services provided by the Park and Tree Board can call 859-441-0075.

Duke Energy Smart Meters coming to Northern Kentucky

In September 2017, Duke Energy will start installing digital smart meters across our Northern Kentucky region. Here are details about what this may mean to you.

- Remote meter reading: After installation, we will no longer have to access inside a homeowner's property for our monthly meter reads.
- Faster moves: With smart meters, you
 may not have to wait for a Duke Energy
 representative to come to you to connect
 or disconnect your energy service –
 because requests can be performed
 remotely.

- Choose your due date: Expanded billing options will be available including the ability for you to pick your own due date.
- Energy info at your fingertips: You will have greater control of your energy use via online access to you daily usage data. You can also get enhanced alerts that notify you when your monthly energy usage may be higher than average.
- Quicker responses to power outages:
 Since smart meters are capable of twoway communication, we will know more about an outage when you notify us, and this speed up power restorations.

Coexisting with Coyote

It is important that we learn how to coexist with the wildlife in our area. If you trap and remove them, more will move into the neighborhood and the females will increase heat cycles, size of litters etc. Do you have deer in your neighborhood? Then you have coyote. The coyote helps us by cleaning up dead, sick or injured deer. They also eat rodents, squirrels etc. They will try to find easy prey. Do not feed them or provide food accidently. Getting fed by humans takes a wild animals' natural fear away. They begin demanding and expecting food. This means dog or cat food left outside, grills that are not cleaned, garbage that is not kept secure and bird feeders. The seeds from bird feeders fall to the ground and small rodents come to eat.

Another item that will bring a coyote closer to your home is a dog in heat. Don't allow your dog, whether male or female to venture into the woods without a leash. When you keep your dog close to you, the coyote will view that as an extension of you. Keeping yards cleared of any wood piles, debris, old dog houses, and over growth will help keep them away.

If there are coyote coming too close, you can use air horns, paint ball guns, or bang on pots and pans to shoo them away. Try not to act afraid and retreat into the house. You don't ever want to make them feel like they claimed the property and ran you off. Wildlife has been here long before us, let's try to live together.

What to look for:

- Work is underway to change out the meters of customers who only receive natural gas service from Duke Energy. This will continue through Sept. 2018.
- Workers from Grid One Solutions will complete the meter installations on behalf of Duke Energy. These workers will have badges specifying that they're Duke Energy contractors. More info at Duke-Energy.com/smartmeter

1-2 items can be placed at curb for regular pickup. Mattresses and upholstered furniture must be wrapped in plastic. If resident has more than 1-2 large items, please call Rumpke 24 hours in advance before a large pick-up at (877)-786-7537.

Items not accepted:

Federal law does not allow pick-up of batteries, tires, liquids (paint), hazardous items. No drywall, concrete, dirt, or rocks in bulk

- The district has received another Preschool Partnership Grant worth over \$110,000.

- We completed a major building renovation in our preschool classrooms with new flooring/walls, fresh paint, new bathrooms, and student furniture.

- We are now offering important wraparound services with a kindergarten enrichment program, after-school program, and full-day preschool option.
- All 2nd graders and 3rd graders are learning to play chess, and there's a chess club.
- 1 to 1 Reading Program continues with some students getting a reading mentor.
- Cross country team finished strong with an individual regional runner-up finish.
- The district hired a full-time counselor to help focus on student character development, mental health needs, data analysis, and continuous growth.
