Block Party - This year the Southgate Volunteer Fire Department Annual Block Party will once again be held on July



Proceeds from the Block Party are used to provide additional equipment, uniforms and other items that supplements our budget with the City. Mark your calendars for July 15 and come hang out with your friends, neighbors and the members of your Southgate Fire Department.

On May 28 the Southgate Fire Department will be participating in the dedication ceremony for the Beverly Hills Memorial. Most of the current members of the department were not even alive on May 28, 1977 when the fire occurred. Those of us who responded to the fire will never forget what we saw and did on that tragic night. This memorial will honor the victims of the fire as well as the first responders, many of whom risked their lives to try and rescue those trapped. The new development on the Beverly Hills Property ends many years of dormancy for the site. The memorial ensures that May 28, 1977 will never be forgotten.

A Note from the Mayor...



Good Morning, Good Afternoon or Good Evening: Once again, I hope this Newsletter and articles finds you and your

family doing well and looking forward to continuing warm weather!

The Beverly Hills Memorial Dedication will take place on Sunday, May 28 at 2pm. The Memorial is at the intersection of US27 and Memorial Pointe Drive. The Dedication will take place in the parking lot of the 525 Alexandria Pike Medical Building. You are welcome to attend. The City will accept the Memorial site as a City Park after the Dedication. May 28 is the 46th Anniversary of the tragic fire.

Road construction will occur on Blossom Lane to repair the "HUMP" and rebuild the drainage on the southside of Blossom Lane downhill towards US27. Work on this project should begin the first or second week of June. Construction may take up 6 to 8 weeks to complete. Memorial Pointe Drive will be used as a detour during construction. Later this summer, the developer of Memorial Pointe will add an additional lane on Blossom Lane at the intersection of US27 and Blossom Lane.

The 2023-24 budget is under review and should be approved by Council by June. Our goal has always been to maintain the current level of taxation or even look for a reduction in taxes to help us all.

As always, if you see a potential problem or need the police, don't hesitate to call us at **859-292-3622**. This is the police dispatch number. The dispatcher can send an officer to you or have them call you directly 24 hours a day. In an emergency always call **911**. For a non-emergency, please call the police department directly at **859-441-7473**.

Please welcome our newest police officers. Charles Boeschenstein will graduate from the police academy on May 10^{th} . Nathaniel Snyder will start the police academy on May 15^{th} . Following academy graduation and a formal field training program, the officers will be out patrolling the City streets.

Summer is fast approaching so please be on cautious while driving through our City. Kids will be outside playing and the police will be out watching your speed and stop signs.

As you complete your spring cleaning, don't forget that we have a

drug take back box at the city building. Any old, outdated or no longer needed prescription drugs can be dropped into the box. These pills will be destroyed so they do not end up in the hands of those that should not have them.

Finally, a reminder to lock your doors of your vehicles and your homes. Please call the police if you see something suspicious in your neighborhoods. Being a good neighbor is sometimes as simple as looking out for each other!

Please mark your calendars for BINGO at the Super Seniors Meeting on Thursday, June 15 at 1 PM at the Community Center.



If you need a dumpster or moving POD in the street in front of your home, you will need to obtain a Street Obstruction Permit 48 hours in advance. This form is on the City's website at www.southgateky.org. Go to the department tab at the top. On the Public Works page there will be a form that you can complete and submit online or you can come into the Clerk's Office. There is no charge for this permit.
